### Highlights of the King Township April 18 council meeting

#### Community grants

Council handed out community grants to various groups, including the Schomberg Agricultural Fair, the Royal Canadian Legion poppy fund and the King Township Food Bank. In summary, \$17,710 of the total budget of \$20,000 was allocated.

#### Public works purchases

Council approved the purchase of a tandem axel diesel dump truck with snow plow. The total cost of \$260,489.32 came in under the budget of \$280,000.

Council approved the tender for the supply and spreading of 20,300 tonnes of granular materials as part of the Township's regular road maintenance program. Walker Aggregates Inc. was the successful bidder for the contract.

#### Transit master plan

Council reviewed and endorsed staff's comments regarding York Region's draft transportation master plan (TMP). A copy of King's TMP will be forwarded, along with the staff report, to York Region for consideration as the region continues developing its own TMP, due out this fall.

Council approved a contract with Emergency Management and Training Inc. for a fire master plan, in partnership with other N6 municipalities. The collaboration with Whitchurch-Stouffville, East Gwillimbury and Georgina will explore efficiencies and innovation, including the development of a shared fire master plan.
