Animal control bylaw

Council received a draft animal control bylaw for review. The objective of the new bylaw—which consolidates several older bylaws and policies—is to be clear, concise and provide for education and effective enforcement.

Water metering program

Council selected the company to continue work on an advanced water metering infrastructure initiative.

Back in 2012, King initiated a meter exchange program to replace all water meters 10 years or older with new meters. Around 3,000 meters have been exchanged since then.

The next phase of the project will be implementing automated meter reading and an advanced metering infrastructure protocol.
