Highlights of the King Township Nov. 14 council meeting

Nuisance and loitering bylaw

Staff presented a draft nuisance and loitering bylaw for council and the public to review.

The draft consolidated several current regulations related to Township property including parks, trails and public nuisances, like loitering in commercial plazas.

The bylaw was driven in part by ongoing and increasing complaints from residents. A staff review found that in many cases, King's bylaws were dated, ineffective or not applicable.
